# The various sections that make up our holiday park are named after places in the local area and we thought that you might like to know a little bit more about their namesakes.

## Quintrell Field

Quintrell Downs is a village close to Newquay and named after the surrounding moorland. The village is surrounded by three farms that can be traced back 200 years and the village once consisted of just 12 houses.

### What to do at Quintrell Downs

**Relax** in the 18th century pub the Two Clomes which serves excellent food (booking advisable).

**Explore** nearby Trerice an Elizabethan manor house and the inspiration for Trenwith in Winston Graham's Poldark

**Experience** all the fun of the farm at Dairyland Farmworld with farm animals, indoor play, nature trails and much more.

## Nanswhyden Row

Nanswhyden was once a country estate complete with a mansion house and formal garden which was destroyed by a fire in 1803 seeing the end to what was thought to be the most expensive house in all of Cornwall.

### What to do at Nanswhyden

**Relax** in the tranquillity of Porth Reservoir a designated bird sanctuary set in a wooded valley. Perfect for a picnic, a short walk and an afternoon of angling.

**Explore** Cornwall's Aviation Heritage Centre where you can sit in some iconic jets and take a look around the aircraft shelter.

**Experience** a round of golf just a hop, skip and jump from Newquay View Resort at Treloy Golf Course.

## Tregurrian Heights

Tregurrian is a small hamlet, two miles east of Newquay and incorporates Watergate Bay, which was once know as Tregurrian Bay. The hotel here was built in 1900 and was originally intended as a terminus for a Newquay to Padstow branch line which never materialised.

### What to do near Tregurrian

**Relax** in a meditative, zen garden with a variety of plants and water features as well as a collection of Bonsai at the Japenese Gardens.

**Explore** Beacon Cove which lies between Watergate Bay and Mawgan Porth. At low tide there is a beautiful secluded beach (not accessible) with an old mine shaft in the cliff to discover and an iron Age fort at Griffin Point.

**Experience** the thrill of catching a wave at Watergate Bay. The huge expanse of sand at Watergate bay has some of the best surf in Newquay. Our own Blue Surf school host their lessons here.

## Gannel Glade

The Gannel River rises in Indian Queens and flows out to the sea via a tidal estuary known as the Gannel. It is a beautiful place to walk but listen out for the Gannel Crake a legendary noise that apparently sounds like "a thousand voices pent up in misery, with one long wail dying away in the distance"!

### What to do at the Gannel

**Relax** with a delicious, fresh crab or lobster salad at the Fern Pit Café.

**Explore** the cave carvings in Piper's Hole on the West side of Crantock Beach. The figure of the women was drawn by a London Artist: Joseph Prater in the 1900s.

**Experience** horse-riding along this scenic estuary with Trenance Riding Stables.

## Pentire

Comes from the Cornsuh words "Penn" which means head and "Tir" land. In Newquay we are lucky enough to have the double headland of Pentire and West Pentire to explore which is separated by the Gannel River.

### What to do at Pentire

**Relax** with the seemingly endless views at the Lewinnick Lodge on Pentire. They also serve up some pretty tasty food and refreshing drinks!

**Explore** the secluded beach, Polly Joke on West Pentire which offers up some stunning Spring flower displays if you walk from here To Holywell Bay.

**Experience** the tiny Crantock ferry named "Sunshine" which operates during the main season to transport you from one Pentir(e) to the other.
